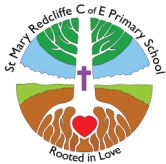

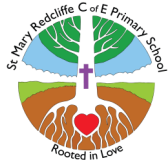
The Green Party won in our school election with 50.9% of the vote. Labour were second with 27.9% and Lib Dems third with 10%
