Muslims believe in God (Allah) and follow the example of the Prophet Muhammad.




Muslims mark the end of Ramadan by a celebration called Eid-ul-Fitr.

RE Vocabulary

Islam	The name of a religion where Muslims believe in one God.
Holy Qur'an 	Holy book of Islam.
Eid	A time of celebration after Ramadan.
Ramadan	Fasting during a certain month of the year. It is believed to bring you closer to Allah.
Prayer Mat 	A mat which Muslims pray on.
Mosque 	A name of a building where Muslims go to worship and learn about the Qur'an.
Mecca	The holiest place for Muslims.
Five Pillars	Muslims follow five rules: prayer, fasting, charity, pilgrimage, and believing of faith.
Imam	Leader of the mosque and community surrounding it
