Bristol has a big **diversity** of different **cuisines** because the city has a large population of immigrants who bring the knowledge and skills of their home culture to the UK.

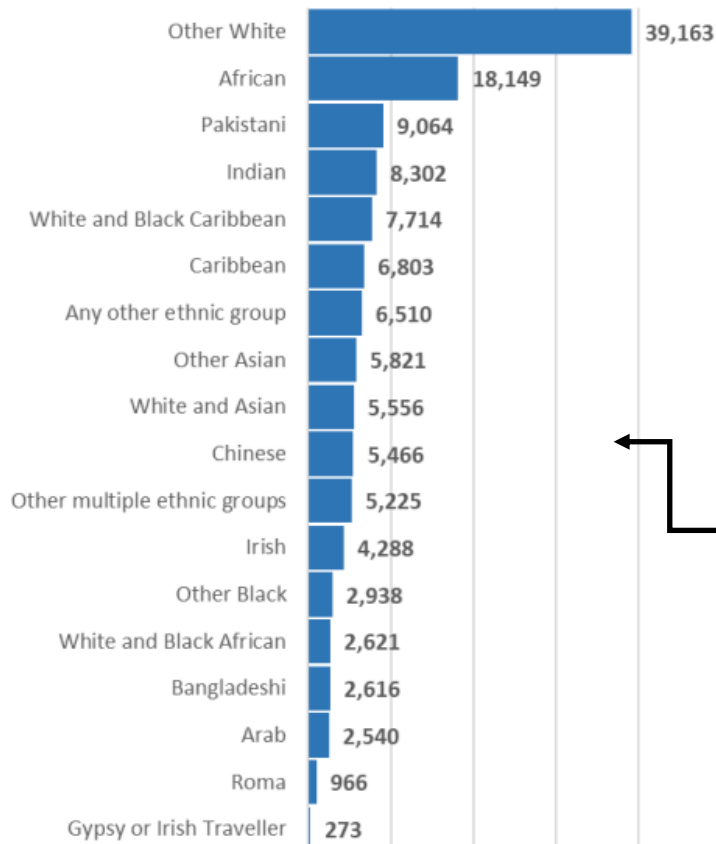
People move to Bristol for lots of reasons. For example, jobs, a better education or to escape danger in their own country.

## History Vocabulary

Word	Definition
<b>Cuisine</b>	A style of cooking shared by a group of people based on their culture, local ingredients and traditions.
<b>Spices</b>	Items of food used to add flavour to cooking.
<b>Immigrant</b>	a person who comes to live in a different country than where they are from.
<b>Diversity</b>	Having a group of people from different cultures, religions and countries.
<b>Halal</b>	Meat that is prepared in a way that considers Muslim values.
<b>Originate/origin</b>	A place where something begins or comes from.
<b>Ethnic group</b>	Community of people that share similar or the same language and culture.
